Monday May 13 WELCOME TO ISRAEL

- Afternoon/evening arrival at Ben Gurion International Airport in Israel
- Head to Israel's modern metropolis Tel Aviv for check-in at our hotel on the shores of the Mediterranean Sea
- Welcome to Israel dinner

Overnight: Tel Aviv

Tuesday May 14 TO BE FREE IN OUR OWN LAND

- Breakfast at the hotel
- Examine the struggles leading up to the birth of the State of Israel, with a dramatic reenactment at Tel Aviv's Independence Hall where David Ben Gurion declared the establishment of the State of Israel in May 1948
- Explore multi-ethnic Old Jaffa with its artist's galleries and thousands of years of history
- Shopping time & lunch on your own at the Nahalat Binyamin Crafts Market & Carmel Shuk outdoor market
- Learn the stories of the early pioneers of the Tel Aviv area with a walking tour through historic
 Neveh Tzedek, the first Jewish neighborhood built outside of Old Jaffa over 120 years ago.
- Enjoy the beautiful urban beaches of Tel Aviv just outside of our hotel
- Evening and dinner on your own in Tel Aviv

Wednesday May 15 UP TO JERUSALEM

- Breakfast at the hotel
- Pack bus and depart hotel
- Visit and meet the children, staff and volunteers at "Save A Child's Heart" a unique project in which Israeli surgeons provide pro-bono cardiac surgery for children from all over Africa and the Middle East.
- Saying lehitraot to Tel Aviv, we'll ascend to Jerusalem and celebrate our arrival with
 Shehechiyanu and the magnificent views of the city from the Haas Promenade. Begin our exploration of the Jewish love affair with Jerusalem starting with the stories of Akedat Yitzhak
 & David's establishment of the city as capital of Israel 3,000 years ago
- Packed Lunch

- Step back 3,000 years to the days of King David and the days of the First Temple at the latest archeological finds at the City Of David (the original Jerusalem); walk through (dry) water systems built thousands of years ago to secure Jerusalem's water supply from invading armies.
- Check-in at our hotel; dinner and evening on your own in Jerusalem.

Thursday May 16 JERUSALEM THE HOLY THROUGH THE CENTURIES

- Breakfast at the hotel
- Visit the innovative Yad LaKashish (Lifeline for the Elderly), including the workshops and gift shop
- Explore the restored Jewish Quarter together and examine the life of the city through the ages including the rooftops, the Cardo and the Kotel overlook.
- Lunch and shopping time on your own in the Old City
- At the Davidson Southern Temple Mount Archeological Park step back 2,000 years to the days
 of the Second Temple. Examine the centrality of the Temple experience in Jewish tradition
- Private prayer and contemplation time at the Kotel (Western Wall)
- At the Kotel Tunnels, continue learning about the Temple experience
- Dinner and evening on your own in Jerusalem

Friday May 17 FROM OUT OF THE CRUCIBLE

- Breakfast at the hotel
- Briefing at the hotel on the latest diplomatic and security issues
- Visit and stand in solemn memory at Israel's Yad Vashem memorial to the Holocaust including the children's memorial and the historical museum
- After Yad Vashem, celebrate the vitality of life in Jerusalem. Explore and have lunch on your own at the famous bustling open-air Machane Yehudah market as the city prepares for Shabbat .
- Return to the hotel to prepare for Shabbat .
- Head to the Old City for our own Kabbalat Shabbat services at the egalatarian prayer area near the Kotel. Then join thousands in greeting Shabbat with song, dance and prayer at the Kotel.
- Home Hospitality Shabbat dinner

Overnight: *Jerusalem*

Shabbat May 18 SHABBAT SHALOM IN JERUSALEM

- Breakfast at the hotel
- Optional Shabbat morning prayer services at one of Jerusalem's many synagogues or take time to explore the city on your own
- Session at the hotel with **Khaled Abu Toameh**, former Arab Affairs Correspondent for the Jerusalem Post: **Can Israel and the Palestinian Authority Make Peace?**
- Lunch on your own
- Late afternoon walking tour to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher where we will learn about the Christian connection to and presence in Jerusalem over the centuries
- <u>Dinner</u> and **Havdallah** ceremony marking the end of Shabbat
- Head to the Tower of David Museum for the Sound & Light Show

Sunday May 19 ROOTED IN THE PAST

- Breakfast at the hotel
- Pack bus and depart hotel
- At Beit Guvrin/Tel Maresha we'll have an archeological adventure, stepping back to the days of the Maccabees, digging up the past with our own hands! (the dig is appropriate for all ages taking place in caves with natural "air conditioning").
- Packed Lunch
- Visit Bedouin Arabs and learn about their struggles for recognition and equal rights in Israel and for internal change in the Bedouin community, especially regarding the role and status of women
- Continue to the Kfar HaNokdim Bedouin Ranch we'll have a **camel trek**, **Bedouin hospitality** and dinner.
- Get a few hours of sleep in nearby Arad before our sunrise ascent to Masada

Monday May 20 WHAT PRICE FREEDOM?

- Breakfast at the hotel
- Wakeup for a pre-sunrise climb to the fortress of Masada where the last Jewish freedom fighters faced the mighty Roman Empire 2,000 years ago.
- Shacharit services and tour atop the mountain as we address the troubling issues presented by the Masada story.
- Descend by cable car or the Snake Path to a simple breakfast.
- Head to the Dead Sea for a float in the Dead Sea and lunch.
- Later, head north through the Jordan River Valley for check-in and <u>dinner</u> at our hotel in **Tzfat**,
 City of the Jewish Mystics

Overnight: *Tzfat*

Tuesday May 21 LAND OF BORDERS

- Breakfast at the guest house
- Delve into the complex security and water issues on the Golan Heights, starting with a nature hike at the beautiful Tel Dan Nature Reserve incorporating the headwaters of the Jordan River & ancient Biblical City Dan.
- Head to Israel's border with Syria to better understand the political and security situation.
- Lunch on your own in Katzrin, capital of the Golan
- Visit and stand in solidarity with IDF soldiers guarding Israel's border with Lebanon. Learn about life on a border Kibbutz.
- Continue Tiberias for a cruise on the Kinneret (Sea of Galilee) and dinner

Overnight: Tzfat

Wednesday May 23 MOUNTAINS & MYSTICS

- Breakfast at the hotel
- Explore the narrow alleyways and synagogues of Tzfat and learn how the mystical traditions that emerged here 500 years ago continue to impact the Jewish world.
- Meet a **Kabalistic artist** in his studio; learn about Kabalah via the lens of art.
- Lunch on your own and time to explore the galleries and shops of Tzfat.
- Head to the summit of nearby Mt. Meron for some light hiking with magnificent views of northern Israel.

Tour, taste and dinner at the award winning Adir Winery and (goat) dairy

Thursday May 24 ISRAEL: LAND OF MANY CULTURES

- Breakfast at the hotel
- Pack bus and depart the hotel
- Head to Haifa. Stand at the top of Mt. Carmel for dramatic views of Haifa and the Bahai
 Gardens. Haifa is the world center of the Bahai faith.
- Continue to Givat Haviva, a community dedicated to fostering peaceful coexistence between Jews and Arabs. Meet Israeli Arabs and gain insight to the complicated nature of Israeli Arab identity.
- Lunch
- At the ancient Roman capital and port at Caesarea, we'll examine the complex relationships between the Roman pagan world and Jews & Judaism during the Second Temple Period and beyond.
- Summary Session and <u>Farewell Dinner</u> before heading to Ben Gurion International Airport for flights to the USA
